Have You Ever Been Cold?

If you were fortunate enough to have attended the 2041 assembly on January 9th with polar explorer Robert Swan, O.B.E., then you know that the answer is emphatically NO, or at least not as cold as he has been. As many of you know, 6th grade teacher Ms. Williams knows what it feels like to be cold. In 2012, Ms. Williams was awarded the "coolest" teacher in America by the U.S. Green Building Council and the Center for Green Schools for her work with students around issues of climate change and sustainability. Later that year, she joined an International Antarctic Expedition to Antarctica with Robert Swan where she further developed her passion for our environment and teaching about sustainable resources.

After Mr. Swan's 2041 presentation on the 9th, he met with Ms. Williams and asked her to form a partnership between LdV and his 2041 foundation. The vision of this partnership is to have LdV assist Mr. Swan on his 2016 south polar expedition. The 2016 expedition will be accomplished using transportation that is solely powered by renewable energy sources. To facilitate this objective, Robert Swan wants Ms. Williams to return with him to Antarctica this March (yes, that is less than two months from now). The plan is for LdV to become 2041's global model for all schools in the world.

While that alone is amazing, it gets even better. LdV is also honored to announce that our own Aidan Fong will also be joining Mr. Swan on his March 2015 expedition. Aidan was so inspired by Mr. Swan's book, 2041 that he sought out as much information as he could about the notable explorer and environmentalist. He watched Mr. Swan's TED talks, and visited his 2041 website. It was on Mr. Swan's website where he learned that he too, could apply to join the expedition. With the help of his parents, Aidan completed the application, interviewed with Mr. Swan and has been formally accepted as an Antarctic Youth Ambassador. Aidan will join Mr. Swan and Ms. Williams on 2041's IAE this March (yes, that is less than two months from now!).

TB test results and Sex Offender Background check clearances: Must be on file before working in the classroom. Fingerprinting must be cleared before driving on or chaperoning fieldtrips.

Please Remember

When approaching an leaving our campus...We ALL have children to drop off or pick up. We ALL have places we need to go. But the most importantly ALL of us need to be safe and courteous. Good behavior under pressure is a great lesson for the children in your car to witness.

Fingerprinting Requirements

Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip...whether you are driving children or not...whether you are going by bus or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Driving on a Field Trip?

The district requirements for insurance (when driving kids on field trips) are as follows: minimum of liability \$50,000/\$100,000 and property is minimum \$25,000.

There are lots of delicious fruits and vegetables growing including nutritious Kale. Try kale in pasta, soup, and my favorite, Kale Caesar salad!

Kale Caesar Salad

1 bunch kale, tough stems removed, cut into ribbons

* I sometimes add chopped romaine to the kale

Dressing:

2 garlic cloves, smashed

pinch of crushed red pepper

½ cup grated parmesan, divided

¼-1/2 cup fresh squeezed lemon juice

1 TBSP Dijon

1-2 tsp anchovy paste

1-2 tsp Worcestershire sauce

1 tsp salt

½ tsp pepper

½ cup Olive oil

2 slices day old Italian bread, cubed and toasted with olive oil, salt and pepper (350 for 20 minutes)

In a bowl or a food processor, combine garlic, crushed pepper, ¼ cup Parmesan, lemon juice, Dijon, anchovy paste, Worcestershire, salt and pepper. Puree until smooth and slowly add the olive oil.

Toss with croutons and remaining Parmesan.

From the Office

Email Sick and Tardy Please email sally-uhlig@scusd.edu with your students' absences and tardies or call 557-0389 wait for the message to begin and then press 49#. By email or phone, leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Please use "absence" in the subject line. You will receive a reply if it has been received. Absence verification must be made daily. Unverified absences will result in truancies.

Llamada para avisar de enfermedad o retraso Favor de llamar a 557-0389 (y seleccione 49 #) al empezar el mensaje) para avisar que su hijo/a va a estar ausente o va a llegar tarde. Deje su nombre, el nombre de su hijo/a, el número del salón, el día de ausencia o retraso, y la razón ("está enfermo/a", "tiene una cita con el doctor", "tiene un funeral familiar", etcetera es suficiente). Le pedimos que llame antes de las 11:00 de la mañana para evitar una ausencia sin escusa.

Bring a Doctor's Note If your child misses school for a visit to the Doctor or Dentist, please bring a school excuse note for their attendance. It does make a difference on a student's attendance report. The attendance code for a Doctor's visit is "M" which is unlimited and without the doctor's note it is an "A". Students are allowed 10 excused (illness with a parent's excuse, death in immediate family, child's appearance in court) absences per the year. Each additional absence from illness must have a doctor's note to be cleared.

Leave a Reason We are asking that you email you child's absence report to sally-uhlig@scusd.edu as early as possible (before 10 a.m.). Please use "attendance" in the subject line and include the child's name, teacher, room number and the date of illness and/or tardy, and the reason. The reason is very important but does not need to be detailed; a simple "She/he is sick today" will suffice. You will receive a confirmation email. Many parents report absences stating their child will be absent, but do not state the "REASON" please remember to so.

Wondering about attendance codes? P = Personal absence – Education Code section 46014 is for: student's court appearance (requires verification), funeral services (one day, in state...three days, out of state; need verification such as a funeral program or name and address of the funeral home), parent's employment conference (requires prior principal approval), student is the custodial parent of a child who is ill or has a medical appointment during school hours. Observance of a religious holiday or ceremony (recommend 3 days advance notice to school).

Did You Know... When your child has chicken pox, a skin rash, lice or other infectious health challenges you need to follow up with the main office when your child returns to campus. A doctor's note that the child has been treated and is okay to be back among our other students after a rash or chicken pox is required by SCUSD health services.

Late to School? Students who are over 30 minutes tardy must be accompanied to the main office by their parent or guardian to obtain a tardy slip. All tardies over 30 minutes must have a parent signature or an official doctor's note. Three tardies over 30 minutes without such documentation will result in a truancy notice.

Check Your Child's Schedule The lunch and recess schedules for all grade levels are readily available on the school website (leonardodavincischool.org). If you are picking your child up for an appointment, or bringing a lunch they left behind, it is easier and quicker to find them in class than on the playground. Please consider timing your trip around your child's schedule. Thank you.

Please Bring Your ID If you are taking your child for early dismissal or are sending someone from your emergency card list, please note ID will be required. It is school policy to show proper ID before a student is released. It is for the safety of your child, please do not grouse at the staff who are keeping our children safe!

Badges Every parent on campus must sign in to the main office. If you are working anywhere on campus get a "Volunteer" badge and sign in the Volunteer book. If you are visiting a classroom, please sign in the book under Mona Lisa and wear a "Visitor" badge. Please sign out in the appropriate book before leaving. These precautions are for the safety of everyone on campus.

Medications at School Parents need to renew their children's medication forms every year. If your child had medication administered by school staff last year, you need to submit a new form this year. You will also need to bring in new medication for this year. Health Services disposes of all unused medication at the end of each year.

Allergy Alert For the safety and consideration of our students with severe nut allergies we are striving to become a "nut free campus." Thank you for your support of our efforts.

Notice of Pesticide/Herbicide Use LdV is scheduled for service by SCUSD's Small Grass Crew weekly. The crew may or may not spray every Wednesday. If they do spray, they will post notice in the front lower window of the front door. A copy of SCUSD's Pest Management Program listing all chemicals applied to all sites is available in the front office.

Your Family Pet Belongs at Home LdV is a pet free campus. For the safety (and cleanliness) of our community please leave any size pets at home (unless okayed by teacher for sharing). Thank you.

Parking Reminder! Please do not park in assigned STAFF parking spots. Our employees arrive at different times throughout the day and need to be able to use their parking spaces. We have unassigned parking spaces in the front lot, the back lot, and on the street. Thank you!
