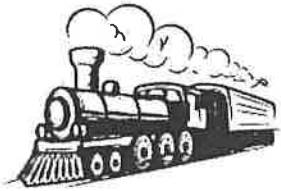

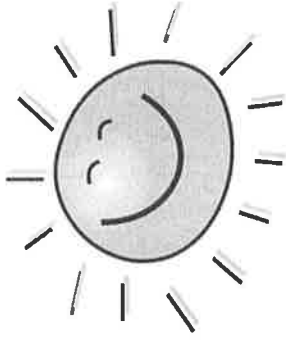

ABOUT OKUI FARMS

In 1948, just after WWII ended, Charlie Sakamoto began growing strawberries on his 5-acre farm, in the tradition of Japanese-American farmers before him. He's been growing berries ever since; today Okui Farms includes 30 acres of strawberries and 150 acres of mixed vegetables.

A family business, Charlie's grandson, Charles Okui, has been managing the farm and working with his sister, Joan Okui, as third-generation Japanese-American farmers. Charles attributes the sweetness of their berries to the micro climate and coastal fog of their location in San Luis Obispo County, along with their practice of keeping the fruit on the vine as long as possible for maximum ripeness before picking.

Charles has a young son who may be the 4th generation Okui berry farmer someday!
