Fingerprinting Requirements: Yes, you do need to be fingerprinted to go on a field trip...whether you are driving children or not...whether you are going by bus or not. The District requires any adult who is not fingerprinted to be in sight of a certificated person at all times, but it is vital that teachers be free to watch their students, not the grown ups who are there to help. So fingerprint please!

Notice of Pesticide/Herbicide Use LdV is scheduled for service by SCUSD's Small Grass Crew weekly. The crew may or may not spray every Wednesday. If they do spray, they will post notice in the front lower window of the front door. A copy of SCUSD's Pest Management Program listing all chemicals applied to all sites is available in the front office.

Call In Sick and Tardy

Please phone in your students' absences and tardies by calling 557-0389 wait for the message to begin and then press 49#. Leave the child's name, room number, date of absence and reason for being out of school (i.e.: illness, doctor appointment, religious, out of town, death in family). Absence verification must be made daily.

These precautions are for the safety of everyone on campus.

Tally Sheets: A September tally sheet was in your first day packet. Please turn it into your child's class or to the Volunteer Office at the end of the month.

Carry Over Hours: Hours from 2012-13 are only carried over to this year if they were worked AFTER May 15, 2013 (and turned in). Thank you to every parent who worked over their required hours last year (most of you). Our program shines because of you!

First Day Packets: Please complete your first day packet and return them to the classroom as soon as possible. Extra forms can be found in the front office.

TB test results and Sex Offender Background check clearances: Must be on file before working in the classroom. Fingerprinting must be cleared before driving on or chaperoning fieldtrips.

President's Ponderings

This week I am going to tell you about the awesome art studio and Art Links programs we have here at LdV. Art is one of the cornerstones of the LdV Integrated Thematic Instruction mode, and the teachers have always infused the curriculum with classroom art projects. But we are also fortunate to have our own Art Studio, Kiln, and a whole suite of thematically rich Art Links course materials that you as volunteers can help bring to your child's classroom. And it is your support of the PTC that makes this possible, as we allocate \$1800 in our budget to purchase studio and kiln supplies.

We were not always so well off. Eight years ago there was no art studio, and the Art Links program lay mostly dormant. Then some volunteers decided to do something about it. First, LdV parent/teacher Ellen Chapman and parent Nicole Hamlin set about finding a place for an Art Studio. Shortly after that, Brookfield School art teacher Mollie Morrison became an LdV parent, and set out on a mission to bring more art to LdV. A transformation was underway. With an Art Studio secured, Nicky and Mollie set about revising the Art Links materials to make them more relevant to the ITI curriculum at LdV. Classroom Art Links volunteers could now work with their teachers to find exciting, interesting, and relevant art projects for their classes which could be created either in the classroom or in the new LdV Art Studio.

The next step came when LdV grandparent and artist Sue Mahon decided to hold an art show of student work. This inspired the start of a variety of Community Art projects, and after-school Open Art Studio sessions, when any child could come create a piece of artwork to be shown and possibly sold. During the past five years the LdV Open Art Studio and Community Art programs have raised money for a variety of causes, including disaster relief for victims of the Haitian earthquake.

Now Mollie, who holds the PTC position of VP Educational Enrichment, has passed the position of Arts Committee Chair on to UnChu Littlefield. Together they are ready to take the Art Studio and Art Links programs to the next level. Also this year the Art Studio will be coordinating several projects with the Learning Garden. And of course they need your help. If you have not already done so, check with your child's teacher to see if your classroom has an Art Links coordinator. Make sure to note when your class Art Links times are and volunteer on those days. Check this newsletter for the after-school Open Studio dates and encourage your children to participate. 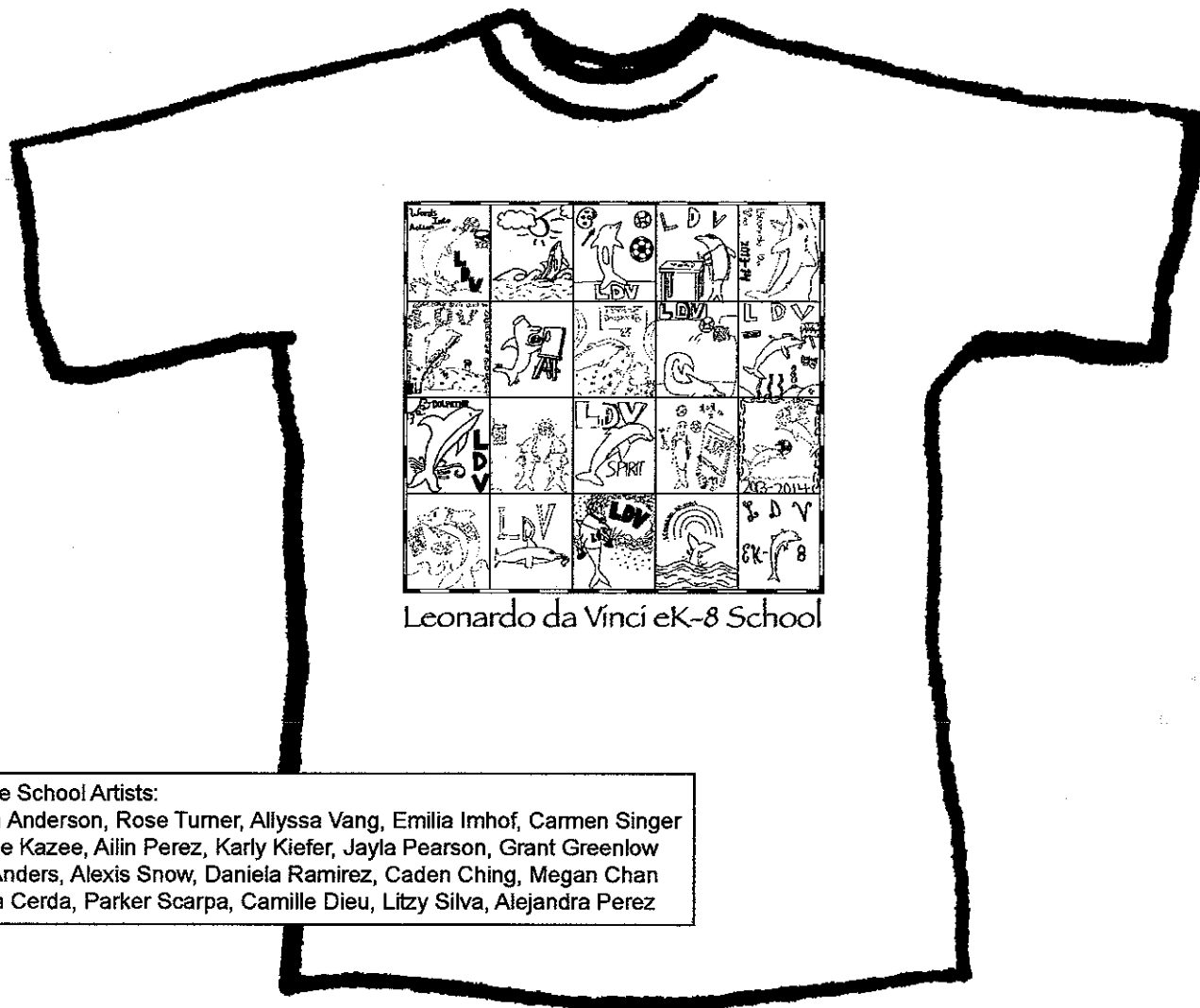

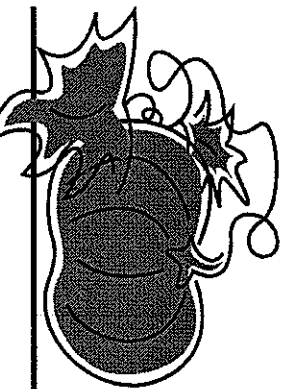

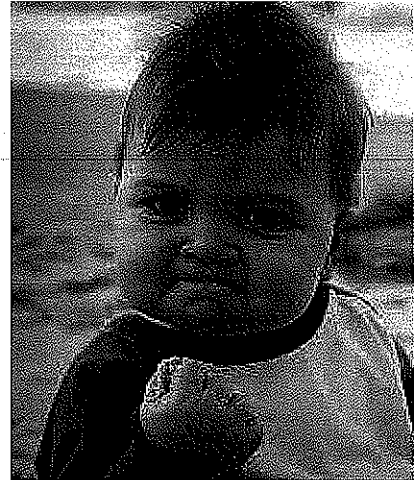
