Call In Sick and Tardy

Absence verification must be made daily.

Lice Advice

Lice are a nuisance, but they are NOT a medical danger. They don't carry illnesses. They are not a sign of someone who isn't clean. They are not something to be ashamed of. Kids share combs, hair ties, hats, and at the pool they might accidentally share a towel. Kids hug and hold onto each other. This is how lice travel from one person to another. Also know that long hair can easily swish through someone else's hair and pick up a louse. It is worth braiding long hair for a week or two until the situation is resolved in the classroom.

Do a thorough examination of your kid's hair, concentrating especially at or near the scalp; behind the ears, and at the nape of the neck. What are you looking for? Small brown/yellowish/white spots (the eggs, or nits), which will be attached to the hair down near the scalp. The nits are VERY small and hard to see. Lice are larger, moving and slightly easier to find with a lice comb that has teeth that are very close together. Don't forget to check yourself and your

It is very important to notify the school office if you do find nits or lice. Awareness, diligent checking and rechecking, as well as through treatment is the only way to RID our school of this pest.

To keep from re-infecting your family/child it is important that in addition to treating the head, you need to do a good vacuuming of the area around the bed/headboard etc., and washing sheets, pillow cases, comforters - put all in a hot dryer if possible. Remove items that cannot be washed (stuffed animals, pillows) from the bed into a bag for 2 weeks (time needed for lice to hatch and die without a human host). Consider doing the same for couch pillows and other items where their cute little heads have been. You should also treat their comb/brush. You can do this by soaking it in very hot just boiled water.

You do not need to freak-out or call in an exterminator. Take a deep breath. Lice and nits cannot live longer than 2 weeks without a warm person. Don't forget to do the follow-up shampoo treatment for killing any live lice that hatched from nits you didn't find.

Editor's Note: If you skimmed through this article and thought, "not me, not my family" think again. I am not embarrassed to say yes me and my family—not just once but twice. In fact after writing this, I will be combing through my own hair, just in case. Anyone is susceptible to lice (regardless of age, cleanliness, or socioeconomic background), especially in a school community. Believe me, keeping aware and informed and watching diligently instead of believing myths and wives tales is the best path of prevention.—Diane Soule

President's Ponderings

I would like to step back this week and update you on the status of our PTC fundraising efforts so far this year. All of the wonderful programs and campus improvements I have written about during the past few weeks would not be possible without your generous financial support of the PTC. So how are we doing?



Fried Green Tomatoes

4 large firm green tomatoes kosher salt

1 cup buttermilk-

1-2 dashes Tabasco

1-2 cups cornmeal

½ tsp salt and ¼ tsp pepper peanut oil or canola oil

Slice tomatoes ¼ inch thick. Lay on a baking sheet and sprinkle with kosher salt on both sides and let them sit for approx. 20 minutes to draw out moisture. Dab with a paper towel.

Heat ½ inch oil in skillet over medium high heat

Dip tomatoes in buttermilk with Tabasco and dredge through cornmeal mixed with salt and pepper. Fry tomatoes on both sides until golden brown. Drain on rack or paper towel. Serve warm.

Can be refrigerated and reheated in oven This is a great side dish served over salad with homemade buttermilk dressing!

Also delicious with an egg in The morning!

Homemade Buttermilk Ranch with a kick!

1 cup mayonnaise

1 garlic clove minced

½ cup buttermilk

½ cup sour cream

½ tsp onion powder

½ tsp garlic powder

1 tsp lemon juice

1 tsp minced chives

1 tsp minced flat leaf parsley

Kosher salt to taste

Dash of Tabasco to taste

Combine mayonnaise and garlic in a large bowl. Whisk in remaining ingredients. Add salt and Tabasco to taste.


